MEDITATION of the DAY: Awake and Watching

encountering the Bridegroom face to face—each of us has to show himself to him for what we have become Initiation into the final stages of divine intimacy cannot be conceived in any but these most personal terms, which require the stripping down of my whole self to the essential core. All this for the simple reason that the Bridegroom yearns to behold the shape and gaze of my unique face. Because God does not love us generically, he does not look for the same quality of love in each one. At that final moment, Christ will be looking for only one thing in me: the inimitable light that he has always wanted to kindle in me and bring forth from me, the unique flame that can flare up only if I have allowed my very heart and soul to catch the fire of his love. This is the light that only I can give, the light that will result from the combustion of my whole being and all its long and intricate becoming, as it offers itself up to the invasion of God's all-consuming Fire of Mercy.

Sobering as the conclusion of the parable may be, we should find much comfort in the very final verse: Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour. With this admonition, Jesus turns his focus away from the drama of the parable and toward his listeners in the immediate present. His concluding therefore encourages them to...begin right now to accumulate oil for the day of their own encounter with the divine Bridegroom. By penetrating words and keen, persuasive images, the patient Teacher is presently hard at work, forming virginal hearts in his hearers, showing them how to distill drop by drop the oil of fidelity and devotion into the lamps of their hearts, against the day when he, and no other, will come as ardent Lover, demanding a pure, flammable offering where his passion may eternally burn. —ERASMO LEIVA-MERIKAKIS

The Catholic Church dedicates the entire month of November to praying in a special way for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Holy Souls, also called the Faithful Departed, are members of the Church who await the purification of their souls before

joining the saints in heaven for all eternity. The poor souls in purgatory cannot pray for themselves or do anything to hasten their entrance into heaven, but we can and ought to pray for them as an act of charity. These Holy Souls have died in the state of grace but are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins, and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must suffer in Purgatory. The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

About The Pope's Nov. Intention on Artificial Intelligence & Robotics

Vatican News announced a video about the Pope's November Intention re: artificial intelligence (AI) and robotics. AI has made exponential advances, as evidenced by its many applications in different fields of knowledge. Today, 37% of organizations in the world have implemented AI in some way (which represents a 270% increase in the past four yrs.)

In "The Pope Video" this month, Pope Francis clarifies that this progress in robotics and AI "can make a better world possible if it is joined to the common good." In this sense, he hopes for technological progress that does not increase the inequalities in society. If it does, the Pope says, it will not be "true progress". Such progress does not take into account the dignity of the human person and care for Creation.

BENEFITS: Al is capable of addressing many problems facing humanity, such as evaluating the learning capacity of students... to detect opportunities for improvement. It can help people with visual or hearing impairments by developing better communication tools (such as converting text to speech or speech to text). Al can also speed up the collection, processing, and diffusion of health data to improve the diagnosis and treatment of patients, especially those living in remote areas. The same applies to the field of ecology. Through Al, it is possible to analyze data on climate change and create models that can help predict natural disasters. It can also be used to create intelligent and sustainable cities by reducing urban spending, improving the resilience of high ways and increasing energy efficiency.
