BISHOP SOTO ISSUES CHALLENGE

SACRAMENTO DIOCESE MARCH 2023:

Bishop Jaime Soto challenges the clergy “to lead people to an authentic encounter with Christ in the Eucharist.” The Sutter Buttes Deanery is now encouraging the faithful in twelve parishes in our deanery to make a journey of faith, a *Camino*, to a different parish each month during the Parish Year of the National Eucharistic Revival from July 2023 to July 2024. Pilgrims will travel once each month for Adoration and hospitality at a different parish in our deanery and have the option to have their unique passports stamped at each location as a beautiful reminder of their *Camino*. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops has promoted the “movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission “for the life of the world.” Pilgrims who make each monthly journey of faith will be blessed abundantly.

ST. ISIDORE CHURCH: THE FIRST CAMINO (complete schedule in passport)

A special passport (each with a unique number) with a commemorative medal attached will be an option available to pilgrims committed to make the *Camino* in time for the first *Camino* parish, St. Isidore Church, 222 Clark Ave. Yuba City. Please arrive by 5:00 pm on Sunday, July 16. This will be a fantastic first stop, since over 300 parishioners there already participate in perpetual adoration. When pilgrims arrive, they will be greeted by local parishioners and given the opportunity to register and to write prayer intentions in a special book of prayer intentions. Then they will be invited into the church for liturgical Adoration and prayer followed by refreshments and fellowship with parishioners who traveled from twelve parishes in our deanery. A

selection of books and resources will be available during this time. Those with passports will be given a unique stamp to show that they attended this first *Camino* with the St. Isidore Church community. This journey of faith will provide pilgrims who traveled to Yuba City to fellowship along the way there and back, dedicating the journey to the love of Jesus in the Eucharist and the love of all of those in our deanery and beyond. EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE:

Lanciano, Italy -- 8th century A.D. A priest has doubts about the Real Presence; however, when he consecrates the Host it transforms into flesh and blood. This miracle has undergone extensive scientific examination and can only be explained as a miracle. The flesh is actually cardiac tissue which contains arterioles, veins, and nerve fibers. The blood type as in all other approved Eucharistic miracles is type AB! Histological micrographs are shown.
