#### The Eucharist as Sacrifice

- 1. Can there be communion without sacrifice? p. 36 No
- 2. What are the fundamental features of sin? p.38 Violence, arrogance (pride), division, blaming, deception, lust for power (pride), and murder
- 3. What is the main way God chose to form his people? p. 39 Teach them to walk in his ways to become a light to all nations
- 4. What must be involved in seeking friendship with God? p. 39 Sacrifice, abandonment of self (rejecting pride)
- 5. **How is a covenant sealed?** p.41 With a sacrifice. Destruction of grain or animal signifies the offering of self (giving up a most treasured possession constitutes self-sacrifice)
- 6. What is the difference between a contract and a covenant? pp. 41-42 What is mine (contract) vs Who is mine (covenant) sealed by a sacrifice
- 7. How did Abraham solve the problem created by Adam and Eve? pp. 43-44 With the sacrifice of Isaac, replacing self-assertion to the point of self-destruction with a most radical self-surrender to God
- 8. What did Moses sacrifice for the covenant? p. 45 Returning to Egypt at great personal risk. Through his own blood, sweat and obedience he led the Israelites to liberty and right worship
- 9. **How did the Israelites seal a covenant?** p.45 With the blood sacrifice of a lamb, obeying the ten commandments as a sacrifice of self, sealed by the blood of the oxen on the altar
- 10. **How did God participate in the covenant?** .p.46 By the splashing of blood on his people pledging his fidelity (lifeblood) to them
- 11. **How was the final covenant of David ratified?** p.47 Through the slaughter of beasts and the smoke of the holocaust
- 12. How did the high priest demonstrate the covenant between the Jewish people and God, and between God and the Jewish people? p. 48 The high priest slaughtered a goat, sprinkled its blood around the holy place and on the people
- 13. What kind of covenant did God desire to replace the covenant sealed by blood? p. 49 He desired the removal of their doings, ceasing to do evil and learning to do good
- 14. How does God propose to deal with Israel's refusal to turn away from sin? pp. 50-51 A suffering servant will offer himself for the sins of many

#### Jesus the Lamb of God

- 15. How did Jesus solve the problem of Israel's sin and unfaithfulness? pp. 52-53 He is God taking on human flesh as a Jew himself becoming both sacrifice (lamb of God) and communion
- 16. How did he show this at his baptism? p. 55 He took on the sins of everyone
- 17. In what other scriptures (3-5) is Jesus the sacrificial lamb? p. 55-59
  - 1) 40 days of fasting (Matt 4:3) p.55
  - 2) Jesus deals with the crowds p. 56
  - 3) The woman at the well (John 4:6) p. 56
  - 4) Riding on a donkey p.57
  - 5) Dying on the cross pp. 58-59

### The Eucharist as Sacrifice

- 18. Where in scripture is the sacrificial significance of Jesus' passion and death made clear? p. 60 "This is my blood of the covenant...poured out (Matt 26:27-28)
- 19. Which covenants come to mind at the Last Supper? p. 61. Abraham (Isaac); Moses
- 20. **How does the Mass transcend time?** p.63 The eternity of Jesus Christ collapses the dimensions of time at Mass.
- 21. In what way is Jesus the perfect high priest sacrificing and atoning for sin? p. 65 Jesus is the exact imprint of God's very being. The juxtaposition of divinity and humanity made Jesus the perfect high priest
- 22. How do the baptized participate in the Mass in a priestly way? p. 67 By their prayers and responses; and uniting their personal sacrifices with the sufferings of Christ
- 23. How is the Eucharistic liturgy a sacred meal? p.68 Because it is a sacrificial offering
